PICTURE OF THE WEEK!

LONG ARMED OCTOPUS– These small octopuses occupy holes in silty sand, sometimes old mantis shrimp burrows. They can swim over the bottom holding their arms together and undulating, much like a flatfish. Little is known about these species and they are rarely seen. Possibly they are nocturnal ? A similar octopus appears in Indonesia, known as the “Mimic Octopus” and able to make itself look like up to 15 other species such as lionfish, crabs, rays, and jellyfish .
