



MAKENA-WAILEA DIVE REPORT

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CRITTER(S) OF THE WEEK!

CROWN TOBY (“pu’u olai”) - The three dark saddles on the back of these tobies may have reminded the ancient Hawaiians of lava flow, for their Hawaiian name means “ cinder cone”. Their bodies are white with yellow dots; blue and yellow lines radiate from the eyes; preferring depths of 20’ or more, they are unlikely to be seen by snorkelers but divers see them on every dive...almost always found in pairs, they grow to about 5”.
