WIRE CORAL GOBY—Wire corals are solitary, whip-like relatives of black coral that grow in areas of strong current. They typically harbor a small fish known as the **Wire Coral Goby**. They scoot up and down the branch, seldom leaving . If you find a wire coral, look near the tip for a band of cleared tissue where the gobbies lay their eggs.
